## Aintree at Nobles Update

Aintree

HELLO

There is currently an ongoing review of local capacity and ability to repatriate patients from Aintree back to Nobles for treatment.

Eylea 8mgs is now in stock alongside the usual dose given currently.

Eylea is the drug used to treat age-related macular degeneration and a larger dose will enable patients to have an extended time gap between injections.

Appropriate patients will be switched over to this dose which will lead to an increase in patient capacity at Nobles.

## Queen's University Trial

We have been asked to sit as an independent, external non-clinical representative on a clinical trial being led by Queen's University, Belfast. Put very simply the trial is to determine the effectiveness of undertaking cataract surgery at the same time as a patient is having surgery for a detached retina, if the individual also requires cataract surgery. We'll let you know more about this as and when we can.
